BACKGROUND

What steps do we need to take today to save the next generation? Our search for a field tested effective process for preventing youth from self-destruction and preserving the future has been less than fruitful. The focus of the Character Centered Leader Rites of Passage process is character development designed to prevent self-destructive behavior and save the next generation and preserve the family.

During the fall of 1989, an assembly of concerned African American males, under the direct leadership of Dr. Sterling Lands II, began the design and implementation of a process to save the next generation of Black leaders. Structured classes and specific programs were developed and implemented.

The process curriculum consists of character development and abstinence education. Since its inception, this process has served several hundred youth from the ages of 5 to 17.

The vision for the future is character-centered leaders of high integrity, committed to excellence, working to build family and community. Our mission today is to prevent family destruction and develop character-centered leaders of high integrity committed to excellence.

A Character Centered Leader of high integrity must be taught what to and how to live by a set of values that guides every thought, word, action, and attitude. Principles of right and wrong must govern each thought, word, and action.

A leader of high integrity is one who is committed to doing the right thing, the right way, for the right reason, expecting the right result, to benefit others.

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was empty, a formless mass cloaked in darkness. And the Spirit of God was hovering over its surface.

Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that it was good. Then he separated the light from the darkness. God called the light "day" and the darkness "night." Together, these made up one day. And God said, "Let there be space between the waters, to separate water from water." And so it was. God made this space to separate the waters above from the waters below. And God called the space "sky." This happened on the second day.

And God said, "Let the waters beneath the sky be gathered into one place so dry ground may appear." And so it was. God named the dry ground "land" and the water "seas." And God saw that it was good.

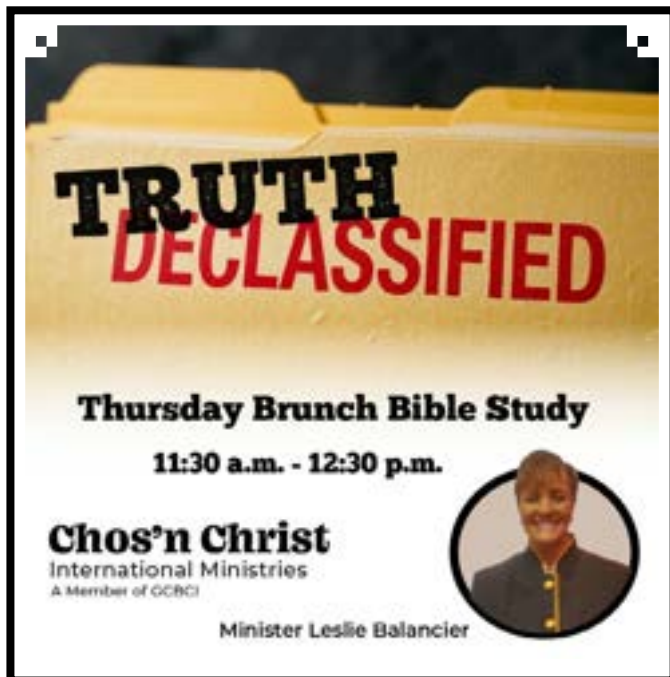

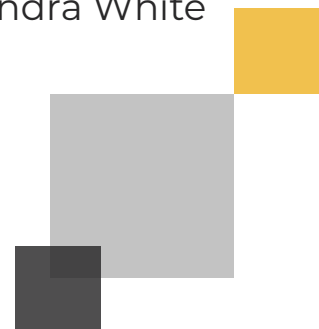
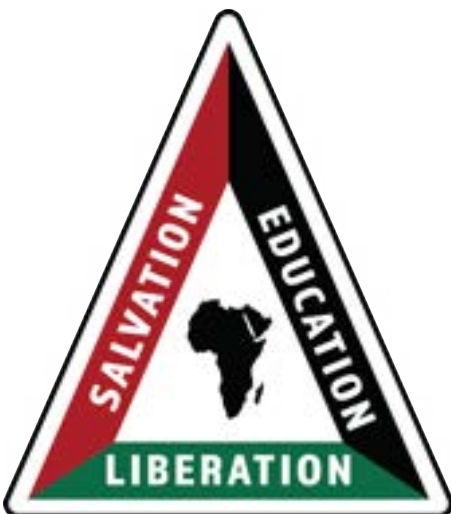
